# Perpetual vows in the Region of Latin America

In the Region of Latin America, Sector of Colombia-Ecuador, the Marianist Family had the joy of participating in the ceremony of perpetual vows of Bro. Wilson Rentería, SM. The profession took place in the San Gabriel Arcángel Parish, very close to the Marianist Sector House in Bogotá.

On December 11 and 12, the religious held a Sector Assembly in the presence of Father Pablo Rambaud, SM, Assistant General for Religious Life, and Bro. Mauricio Silva, SM, Sector Superior of Chile. This fraternal meeting took place at the same time as the profession. The timing of this meeting allowed almost all

the Brothers of the Sector to witness this very significant and important step for Bro. Wilson.

Marianist Sisters and members of the CLM. also attended the Eucharist, presided by Father Pablo. In addition, representatives of the Parishes of Caridad and Blessed Chaminade of Bogota, as well as from the Parish of Espiritu Santo and the school of the same name located in Girardot were present for this profession. For many years, Bro. Wilson has shared his life and his mission with all of these people.

By delegation of the Regional Superior, Fr. Luis Casalá, SM, the Sector Superior, Bro. Pedro José Castañeda, SM, received the vows. The celebration ended with heartfelt words of thanks and a request for prayer from the newly perpetually professed, followed by the traditional photo session and a delicious meal shared with the Marianist Family.

## Visit to the Sector of Colombia-Ecuador

From December 4 to 17, Father Pablo Rambaud visited the sector of Colombia-Ecuador, together with Brother Mauricio Silva, superior of the Chile sector and member of the Regional Council of Latin America.

The General Council had made the canonical visitation to Colombia-Ecuador in

January and February 2019. In May 2022, the new Latin America Region was created and, having gone almost five years without any member of the Council visiting this sector, it was deemed appropriate to make a new visit to the communities. The main purpose was to listen to the brothers of the Sector and to see how the new Region was developing. Therefore, it also seemed appropriate for one of the members of the Regional Council to participate in the visit.

The visit began in Ecuador on December 4, visiting the brothers, first in Quito and then in Latacunga. They celebrated the Feast of the Immaculate Conception with the community of the Daughters of Mary Immaculate (Marianists) of Latacunga. That same afternoon they traveled to Bogota. The first visit was to the Sector House community, where, on December 11 and 12, the Sector Assembly was held, with the presence of all the religious living in Colombia and Brother Roberto Bordignon, who traveled from Ecuador. Two days of meetings and sharing on the reality of the Sector, its challenges and strengths. These meetings concluded on the afternoon of the day of the Virgin of Guadalupe with the celebration of the perpetual profession of our brother Wilson Rentería.

The rest of the days were dedicated to meetings with the other communities (Girardot, Blessed Chaminade and La Caridad), especially the interviews with the brothers. In addition, the visitors were able to participate in several Eucharistic celebrations in the parishes, in the celebration with the staff of the

Chaminade Foundation, and in the distribution of food and toys to adults and street children.

We thank all the brothers of the Sector and especially Brother Pedro Castañeda, Sector Superior, for his preparations for the meetings, his welcome, and for his willingness to share his life and concerns with us.

# **New Beginnings at the Madeleine**

Today, January 1, 2024, marks a new beginning for one of our oldest, and certainly the "charismatic mother" of our Marianist missionary tradition. The Chapel of the Madeleine in Bordeaux takes up a new structure with the hope of strengthening and expanding its vital mission to the people of Bordeaux and the members of the Marianist charismatic family throughout the world. Bro. Hervé Guillo du Bodan, SM, Rector and Superior of the community, along with the other members of this international community, seek to continue to provide religious services, especially through liturgies and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, that have been so important to the local faithful. They hope to expand this outreach with the introduction of other programs and opportunities, including regular collaboration with the Institution Sainte Marie Grand Lebrun. At the same time, expansion of opportunities for charismatic and historical research is envisioned, taking advantage of the many resources available in the archives, library and site of our Blessed Founder. The proximity of Bordeaux and Agen afford an even broader opportunity for mutually beneficial study between members of the SM and the FMI, as well as lay Marianists and other scholars.

# **Father Raymond Halter: healing inner wounds**

25 years ago, on the night of December 25-26, 1998, Father Raymond Halter set off to meet the Lord and the Virgin Mary, whom he had served all his life. At a time when we had just celebrated the birth of God made man, Raymond, whose stature and face expressed a strong fatherly image, was leaving this world, as if he were stepping aside to make way for Jesus.



A man of great intellectual ability, Father Halter contributed to the development of Marianist spirituality through his study of the *writings on prayer* of Blessed G.-J. Chaminade. He also wrote the book: *The Virgin Mary in the life and work of Paul Claudel.* Appointed general chaplain to the students of Bordeaux, he continued his personal training to better respond to the university world around him.

During a weekend with a group of young people in 1973, they experienced life in the Holy Spirit. Shortly afterwards, following a car accident, he lost his sight. For a man who read Le Monde every day and kept abreast of the latest publications, he overcame this tragedy through prayer and the grace of the Holy Spirit. He regained some of his sight following an operation in Nancy, where the surgeon told him that a miracle could also be God guiding his hand. At this time, his superiors sent him to the city of Moselles. From the intellectual milieu of Bordeaux, he had to adapt to the simple people of this working-class city.

Many injured people asked him for help. He accompanied and preached inner-healing retreats. He examined the root causes of wounds, the ravages of spiritualism, satanic links, etc., and warned against the New Age currents that were on the rise. The work was demanding and the requests were numerous. When he was assigned to Abidjan, he suggested to the Provincial that he set up a retreat center in France, where he could spend the whole year. However, God had other plans for him.

He trained people to provide this support. At the start of the retreats he preached, small listening teams were set up to welcome those whose wounds are too heavy. He knew how to surround himself with people who were discerning and not left alone with all the human misery.

We ourselves carry inner wounds or accompany wounded people. Let's take a

moment to let Jesus descend into our inner hell, to let him visit us. Through Father Halter's intercession, let us ask to be visited by the Lord, through the grace of his Holy Spirit. We can make our own the prayer he formulated at Lourdes on July 1, 1979:

You know all our needs, Lord. All those of our body, our emotions, our intelligence, our spirit. You know our hearts. You, Lord, who made us to love and be loved, know everything that life, everything that men, everything that events have wounded in us, or sometimes perhaps killed within us. Lord, you who know us in the depths of our being, you who know our whole existence, come and give each of us what we need most to blossom in the love you put in our hearts and for which you created us. Come and heal in each of us what prevents us from loving those around us. Those things that prevent us from serving those around us.

Lord, we are here in confidence, in peace. We want to tell you now as we look at you, as we look at your face of love and compassion. Lord, heal us, to teach us more how to love, how to be loved. Amen
